

### READINGS FOR THE THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (B)

**First Reading - (Daniel 12:1-3)** - This contains a vision of the prophet Daniel about the end of time. It introduces the belief in a resurrection of the dead and the notion of retribution after death.

**Responsorial Psalm - *Preserve me, God, I take refuge in you.***

**Second Reading - (Hebrews 10: 11-1, 18)** - This reading insists on the superiority of the sacrifice made by Christ over all the sacrifices of the old law.

**Gospel Reading - (Mark 13:24-32)** - This talks about the destruction of Jerusalem and the second coming of Christ. Certain signs will precede the first, but the time of the second is known only to God.

**JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE** - Next Sunday is the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King, the last Sunday of the Church year.

**CALENDAR** - On **Wednesday** we celebrate the **Presentation of Our Lady in the Temple**, a feast which dates back to 5th century Jerusalem. The 3rd century Roman martyr and patroness of musicians, **St. Cecilia**, is honoured on **Thursday**. On **Friday** is commemorated **St. Clement** (+100) the third Pope after St. Peter, whose Letter to the Corinthians is of great importance. Also on **Friday** we have the great Celtic missionary **St Columbanus**. On **Saturday** we recall the two and a half centuries of persecution sustained by the Church in Vietnam. There were 130,000 victims, of whom 117 have been officially canonised. They include the Vietnamese priest **Saint Andrew Dun Lac**, and the French priest **Saint Theophane Venard**, whose writings inspired St. Therese of Lisieux to offer herself for the missions.

**CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK** - This weekend (17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup> November 2018) we celebrate Catholic Education Sunday in our parish, a day when we pray for the continuing success of Catholic Schools in serving our own community and contributing to the well-being of the country as a whole. We remember with gratitude our ancestors who set up and supported our Catholic Schools with very little in the way of resources. Keeping up the Church agencies which help promote and support (and sometimes defend) our schools is costly. The annual Special Collection, which is usually taken up this weekend to support the work of the Catholic Education Commission and the Scottish Catholic Education Service which help to develop and support our excellent schools, will be taken at all Masses this weekend 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup> November 2018.

The Diocesan Annual Education Mass will take place in Motherwell Cathedral on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> November 2018 at 7pm. Particular focus this year will be on the 100th anniversary of the Education (Scotland) Act 1918, which established the framework for Catholic Education in Scotland. This was the Act that saw Catholic schools transfer from Diocesan control to State governance.

As part of the 2018 celebrations to mark the centenary of the 1918 Education Act, Jesus the Icon was welcomed to the Diocese of Motherwell. The Icon was created by Ms Bernadette Reilly, a parishioner of St Bartholomew's Church, Coatbridge. Ms Reilly was commissioned by SCES (Scottish Catholic Education Service) to create the artwork ahead of the centenary, and it has since travelled across much of Scotland. It is hoped that the Icon, and all that it represents, will be a fitting legacy for the first 100 years of the partnership between Church and State in governing Catholic Schools in Scotland.

The icon is now set to remain in the diocese until 20 November 2018. During the week, it can be found in Our Lady of Good Aid Cathedral, Motherwell. At weekends, the icon will visit various host parishes in each deanery in Motherwell Diocese in order to be as accessible as possible for schools and parishioners. The Icon's next stop after Motherwell is St Andrews & Edinburgh Archdiocese.

Today, Catholic Schools, as a community of faith and learning, have been able to provide the highest quality of education and to offer formation through the promotion of Gospel values, through celebration and worship, and through service to the common good. We thank God for the achievements of our young people and for the support of parents, teachers, education officials and politicians who have contributed to this great achievement over the decades.

Once again our Bishops have asked us to take a special collection in all the Scottish Dioceses to help fund the work of the Scottish Catholic Education Service. This provides the salaries for those employed and the services provided to support Catholic Education in our Primary and Secondary schools. This Special Collection will be taken up at all Masses this weekend 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup> November 2018.

**ENROLEMENT MASS** - Some of our children from St Charles' Primary School will be enrolling themselves for the Sacraments of Reconciliation & First Holy Communion at 10am Mass on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2018 and from St. Cadoc's Primary School will be enrolling themselves for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion & Confirmation at 11.30am on 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2018. As Parish Community of St. Cadoc's, let us support them through our prayers and example at this special time.

**ETIQUETTE AT MASS** - The celebration of the Mass is central to the life of the People of God. It is a sacred time that requires all our devotion and our full participation. Because of its importance certain behaviour is expected and necessary for the good of everyone present. The first and foremost

requirement is that, out of respect for the liturgy and those who wish to engage in private prayer before and after Mass, we maintain a reverent silence in the Church. Also, please remember to turn off your mobile phones before entering the church. If you must receive a call in the event of an emergency, kindly put your phone in silent mode.
